<p data-bbox="190 367 473 402"><i>Lint Roller Pick Up</i></p> <p data-bbox="110 451 567 870">Give your child a lint roller to hold. Place pieces of paper, fabric, tissue paper or cotton balls on a tray. Then ask (and show) your child to roll the lint roller on the tray and pick up as many materials as possible. Then, encourage your child to remove some of the materials from the lint roller and place it back on the tray to play again!</p> 	<p data-bbox="647 367 1016 402"><i>Drawing and Scribbling</i></p> <p data-bbox="620 451 1077 789">Place a large paper on the floor/ table. Take two or three crayons/markers and put tape around them to attach them together. This allows your child to hold the marker/crayons with their whole hand and create line or patterns on the paper with large movements.</p> 	<p data-bbox="1247 358 1419 391"><i>DIY Tunnel</i></p> <p data-bbox="1096 440 1569 548">Save an empty cardboard box that's the right height and size for your child.</p> <p data-bbox="1096 597 1569 706">Open and tape the flaps to each other so the box is more secure (and doesn't collapse easily on your child).</p> <p data-bbox="1096 755 1569 863">If the box is still flimsy despite best taping efforts, prop it upright against a wall and a chair.</p> <p data-bbox="1096 912 1569 1092">Decorate the box with interesting items for additional sensory fun (e.g., tape colourful ribbons at the "entrance" and put sensory shakers and small toys in the box).</p> 	<p data-bbox="1731 367 1938 402"><i>Family Finger</i></p> <p data-bbox="1623 451 2045 716">Transform your fingers into a family by taking a black marker and drawing a family member (or character) on each finger. Wiggle each finger accordingly as you sing songs such as, <i>Where is Thumbkin</i> or <i>This Little Piggy</i>.</p>  <p data-bbox="1615 1149 2064 1330">Song lyrics and tunes can be found online, check out https://connectability.ca/2014/07/17/creative-circle-time-music-stories-games/</p>	<p data-bbox="2201 367 2475 402"><i>Indoor Racetrack</i></p> <p data-bbox="2112 451 2561 789">Clear the space on the floor. Make the racetracks with masking tape or painters tape. Make the racetrack in straight lines and scatter cars, planes or other wheeled toys on the floor. You and your child can explore by rolling the cars and planes on the racetrack back and forth.</p>
