








# Activities for Kindergarten Children

<p align="center"><b>Making Cloud Dough</b></p> <p>Children can explore textures, colours, scents, and learn how to measure while making Cloud Dough.</p> <p><u>Ingredients:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 part cornstarch</li> <li>• ½ part hair conditioner</li> <li>• food colouring</li> </ul> <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Mix with a spoon until you get a smooth fluffy dough texture.</li> <li>2. Add more cornstarch for thicker feel, and conditioner if it's too dry.</li> </ol> 	<p align="center"><b>Alphabet Search</b></p> <p>Help your child find or think of 5 things that begin with the first letter of their name.</p> <p>Draw a picture of each item and write out the words (adults may need to provide some assistance).</p> <div data-bbox="634 781 1016 1274" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px; text-align: center;">  </div>	<p align="center"><b>Literacy Salt tray</b></p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A baking sheet</li> <li>• Salt</li> <li>• Food colouring (optional)</li> </ul> <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Pour enough salt on to the tray that if you were to run your finger through the salt, you'd see what you're drawing.</li> <li>2. Encourage children to practice writing their names or numbers.</li> <li>3. You can add food colouring to salt the night before to make it a fun colour.</li> </ol> 	<p align="center"><b>Family Interview</b></p> <p>Talk to an adult in your family about a special events or celebrations that happens this month? For example, Passover, Easter, Earth Day, World Health Day, National Sibling Day, April Fool's Day, Autism Awareness Month, etc.</p> <p>Ask questions, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Special event name.</li> <li>- What day is the special event?</li> <li>- Who celebrates this event?</li> </ul> <p>Draw a picture of what you learned.</p> 	<p align="center"><b>Indoor Hopscotch</b></p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Painters tape (lots of it)</li> </ul> <p><i>Painter's tape is great because it can be removed from almost any surface without leaving any residue.</i></p> <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Follow the picture below for an example of making the hopscotch outline.</li> <li>2. Encourage children to hop on one foot, or two feet at a time, etc.</li> </ol>
