<p align="center">Recycled Egg Carton Masks</p> <p>Materials: Egg carton, popsicle stick, scissors, glue, materials to decorate (paint, stickers, markers, crayons)</p> <p>Direction Cut apart the egg carton in pairs Cut out circles for eyes. Decorate with paints, markers or stickers. Glue on a popsicle stick and attach on the side of egg carton. You are done!</p> 	<p align="center">Paper Plate Fish</p> <p>Materials: Paper plate. paint, markers, or crayons, brush (if using paint), scissors, glue, large wiggle eye (optional)</p> <p>Direction Paint or make marks on the paper plate with crayons/markers to decorate. Let the plate dry if painting before doing step 2. Cut a large triangle out of one section of the paper plate. Use the triangle you just cut out of the plate to make a fishtail on the opposite side of the cut-out portion. Glue it to secure. Glue the googly eye above the mouth or use a marker to draw an eye. **If you do not have any paper plates, you can trace a circle on a piece of paper with a bowl and cut it out. Then follow the directions 1-5.</p> 	<p align="center">Hallway Bowling</p> <p>Materials: 1 ball, 6-10 filled water bottles or milk cartons, or toilet paper rolls (or a mixture of all 3).</p> <p>Directions Line up the bottles/cartons/toilet paper rolls at the end of a hallway. Place a piece of tape on the floor at a distance from the pin set up (optional). Roll the ball to hit down the pins. Make it even more fun by rolling the ball between your legs, trying it backwards, or laying down on your stomach and giving the ball a big push!</p> <p>*This activity could also be done outside. The pins can also be numbered to incorporate counting and number recognition.</p> 	<p align="center">Lemon Volcano</p> <p>Materials: 1 lemon and cut to (2 halves), baking soda, food colouring (optional), dish soap, plate bowl or tray, popsicle stick</p> <p>Direction Place half of a lemon into a bowl or plate that will catch all the mess. Take your craft stick and poke holes in the various sections of the lemon. Place drops of food coloring around the different sections (optional). Pour dish soap all over the top of the lemon. Sprinkle a generous amount of baking soda onto the top of the lemon. Drop some lemon juice on top, wait 1 minute, and it will begin to erupt.</p> 	<p align="center">Building a Blanket Fort</p> <p>Materials: Chairs/couches, pillows, sheets and blankets, safety pins / clothespins, flashlight, books</p> <p>Direction Move two chairs back to back. Stack books so the chairs will be stable. In between will be your very own fort. Drape the blankets over the chair for a roof. Decorate your fort with a flashlight, pillows and stuffies to make it cozy.</p> <p>*This works best on a carpeted surface.</p>
