<p style="text-align: center;">Story Time Bottles</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recycled bottles Story book Items that relate to the story (e.g., The Very Hungry Caterpillar will have fruits, vegetables, leaves, etc.) Water Food colouring Baby Oil <p><u>Directions:</u> Using your child’s favourite story book, collect items from around the house and along with your child place them in a bottle.</p> <p>Fill your bottle ½ of the way with water. Fill your bottle with ¼ of oil.</p> <p>Create multiple bottles for multiple stories and use them during reading stories.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Funny Family Collage</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Photos of your family Child safe scissors Picture frame Glue paper <p><u>Directions:</u> With adult assistance, have your child cut out different body parts, heads etc...from your family photos.</p> <p>Help your child on paper cut...and create a picture.</p> <p>Cut and paste the desired cut out to form a new body for your family member.</p> <p>This will be a fun for the whole family!</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Tong Race</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kitchen tongs 2 baskets Recycled paper (rolled into a ball) Painters tape Timer <p><u>Directions:</u> Position the baskets on either side of the room.</p> <p>In one basket place 5-10 paper balls. Using the painters tape, create an obstacle course for your child in between the two baskets.</p> <p>With a timer, have your child place the paper balls from one end of the room to the other going through the obstacle course.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Paper Plate Number Flower</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper plate Paint/markers/crayons Child safe scissors Sticks/dowels/popsicle sticks Glue <p><u>Directions:</u> Have your child, cut 10 slits on the edge of the paper plate.</p> <p>Let your child paint, decorate the flower and glue on the stick of their choice.</p> <p>Write down numbers (depending on how many you create) on the plate.</p> <p>You can hang up your child’s art work on your home window!</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Run Around Scrabble</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper Tape Writing Tool (markers, pens, crayons) Dice <p><u>Directions:</u> With adult assistance, have your child write the letters of the alphabet and stick them around the house.</p> <p>On a separate piece of paper, write down words that are simple enough for your child to spell out (cat, hat, dog etc..) to use as reference.</p> <p>Roll the dice. Depending on the number the dice lands on, that will determine how many letters your child is able to grab (e.g., Rolls on 3 – child can grab 3 letters, rolls on 1 – child can grab 1 letter etc..).</p>
