








Activities for Kindergarten Children

<p align="center">Shape Robots</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Construction paper cut into a variety of shapes 2. Glue and scissors 3. Markers and crayons <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <p>Have your child cut the construction paper into different shapes. If needed you can help your child draw different shapes and they can use the scissors to cut around the outline.</p> <p>Using glue, your child can create their shape robot. Once they are done, they can decorate the shape robot with markers or crayons.</p> 	<p align="center">Blow Art Monsters</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Scissors and glue 2. Blank paper 3. Watercolour or paint with some water in it 4. Markers or googly eyes 5. Straws <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <p>On the blank paper pour two dots of paint. Using the straw have your child blow into it while moving the straw to move the paint around the paper. Once the paint is dry, your child can glue on some googly eyes or draw eyes with a marker.</p> 	<p align="center">Solar Oven</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Using either a pizza box or any kind of cardboard box 2. Aluminum Foil 3. Black construction paper 4. A stick or a ruler 5. Scissors (with assistance) <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <p>Using the scissors have your child (with assistance) cut out an opening in the middle of the box to create a lid. Inside the box, glue black construction paper to the bottom of the box. Glue aluminum foil onto the sides of the box and cover the lid with foil. A stick or ruler can be used to hold the lid up. Your child can now decorate the box.</p> 	<p align="center">Making S'mores</p> <p><u>Ingredients:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Graham crackers or any crackers you prefer 2. Chocolate of your choice 3. Marshmallows 4. Solar oven (see activity to the left) <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <p>Assemble the ingredients together like a sandwich as shown in the picture below. Using the solar oven, place the s'mores onto the bottom and cover the opening of the oven with plastic wrap. Using the ruler or stick have it hold the lid up and place the oven facing the sun. The sun's reflection should be on the s'mores. Once you see the chocolate and marshmallow melted, they are done. Time to enjoy!!</p> 	<p align="center">Making Bouncing Bubbles</p> <p><u>Materials & Ingredients:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 1 Tbsp dish Soap 2. 4 Tbsp water 3. 2 Tbsp sugar 4. Bubble wands & bowl 5. Winter glove <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <p>Mix the dish soap, water and sugar in a bowl. Make sure all the sugar has dissolved. Use the bubble wand to gently blow bubbles. Children can then use the glove to gently try and hold and bounce the bubbles.</p>
