<p align="center">Caterpillar Race</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> coloured paper scissors straws (reusable if you have) origami skills <p><u>Directions:</u> Please refer to the link below on how you and your child can create the origami caterpillar step by step.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IxEhFgJ-Bjk</p> <p>Then you and your child can have a caterpillar race!</p> 	<p align="center">Cherry Blossom Tree</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> paint glue paint brush canvas, construction or white paper scissors coloured buttons <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> On the canvas or paper, you or your child can use paint to draw a tree with branches. Let it dry. Have your child glue the coloured buttons on the branches to create your cherry blossom tree. <p><i>If you don't have coloured buttons you may also try to use: finger prints and paint, cut coloured paper into small circles, cut white paper into small circles and colour them, use markers or crayons to draw the tree.</i></p> 	<p align="center">Musical Instruments</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> empty water bottle(s) coloured and or non-coloured noise-making objects; buttons, paper clips, coins, pasta, peas, beans, rice, corn, beads, toothpicks, buttons, etc. tape <p><i>You may make it a "nature" noise maker if you are able to go for a walk and collect objects.</i></p> <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Together with your child, gather items for each bottle. Place items into the bottle. Close the bottle cap. Tape around the cap to keep it sealed. Your child then gets to shake or explore items in the bottle. 	<p align="center">Rainbow Salt Art</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> salt paper small glass jars (baby food jars are good) coloured chalk <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Together with your child, pour a small amount of salt onto the paper. Picking one piece of coloured chalk at a time, have your child roll the chalk back and forth on the salt to get the desired colour. Hold the paper and pour the coloured salt at an angle into the jar. Repeat until the jar is full with all your child's favourite colours. 	<p align="center">Circle Art</p> <p><u>Materials:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a tray or plate coloured paint toilet paper roll or circular object; paper cup/ plastic glass <p><u>Directions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Pour some paint onto a plate/tray. Your child can place one end of the paper roll into the paint one colour at a time Dab the roll on the white paper. Have your child repeat using different colours to make their own design or pattern.
